WELCOME!

We are glad you are worshiping with us today.

Preparing for Worship – Upon arrival, we keep silence in the church that we all may pray quietly in preparation for worship. Please remember to silence your cell phones.

Children's Chapel has moved to a new space in the same building as the church. Children's chapel will now be located in what was an office space, west down the long hallway behind the altar, the first room on the right when you get to the office area. Children will rejoin their care-givers just before the peace.

Children of all ages are always welcome in worship! There are three soft spaces around the sanctuary where children and their caregivers can worship together in developmentally appropriate ways. In the narthex (entry way) you will find rocking chairs for parents of young children as well as worship supports for people of all ages including sensory tools, illustrated worship bulletins, children's books, and quiet toys. In addition, nursery care is provided in the Day School during the 9:00 Service.

Donations: We welcome donations to support the work of St. Michael's whether a payment on a pledge or simply an offering. You can leave cash or a check in the plates, or give any time on our website stmichaelsabq.org



Hearing Assistance: Hearing assistance devices are available from the ushers. Please ask for help if you need one. Our church also has a loop system: to activate, turn on your T-Coil.

Accessibility: If you need to sit, stand, or move at any time, please do not hesitate. We use the words "please rise in body or in spirit" to indicate the places where many of us will stand, but we know that bodies have different needs at different times.

Get Involved: If you begin by filling out a "Welcome Card" in your pew, or at the Welcome Table, we'd be glad to keep you up to date with all that goes on here. You can also use the cards to update your information, request prayers, or to ask a question. Turn them in to an usher, a clergy person, or in the offering plate when it passes.



A READING FROM THE BOOK OF ISAIAH


Please be seated Isaiah 58:6

A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Acts 16: 25-34

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

Gracious God, remember your body, the Church. We remember especially the LGBTQ+ Ministry of the Diocese of the Rio Grande. Make us strong only with your strength, the strength of humble service. *Silence*

May your church reflect your kin-dom on earth. Come to your people and set us free!

Christ Jesus, remember this nation. Guide our feet into the way of peace. Raise up leaders who will govern their people wisely. Walk with those who work for justice. *Silence*

May we remember our citizenship in your reign of love. Come to your people and set us free!

Word of God, all things in heaven and on earth are created through you and for you. May we who care for your creation do so with all due respect. *Silence*

May we be stewards of your commonwealth on earth. Come to your people and set us free!

Savior Christ, remember this region in which we live and work and worship. Drive far from us all fear and dismay. Rescue the missing; find the lost. May all of your children live in safety. Silence

Help us to bring the lost, the least, and the left out into your reign of justice and wholeness.

Come to your people and set us free!

Christ our King, you know intimately the experience of pain and suffering in your own body. May all those suffering know that you are with them in their pain, may they feel your presence with them.

May we trust that your reign comes with justice and healing.

Come to your people and set us free!

You are invited to add your own prayers, silently or allowed.

Resurrected Christ, accept those who have died into your reign of love. Give all the departed peace, and in the fullness of time, raise them to newness of life. Unite us at the banquet at the end of days. *Silence*

Reunite us in the Communion of your Saints, where sorrow and pain are no more. **Come to your people and set us free!**

RITE OF RENAMING

Presider Hear the invitation of God: From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh; even though we once knew Christ according to the flesh, we know him no longer in that way. So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. (2 Cor 5:16–20)

The Presider turns to Silas, asking:

How do you respond to God's invitation?

Silas I am a new creation, grateful to embody Christ's image.

Presider We are also here to affirm the name of Silas Michael Brandel. This name expresses who Silas is and who he is becoming, through the grace of God.

We honor the name given to him by his parents and acknowledge that the time has come to declare a new name. We honor the name he has chosen, and acknowledge those loved ones who have made holy space for a new name to be spoken. This new name is the culmination of a journey of discovery and, at the same time, a new beginning.

Please rise in body or in spirit.

Presider Will you do all in your power to assist Silas to embody Christ's message of

reconciliation?

People We will.

Presider Will you honor Silas in name and in spirit as he continues on his path?

People We will.

Presider Dynamic and holy God, we remember how you changed the names of Abraham and

Sarah, as they set out to follow you. We marvel that you changed the name of Jacob, after a long night of wrestling with you. We recall our ancestors in the faith who were given new names as their vocations to serve you were revealed. We now declare

publicly and affirm the name you have bestowed upon Silas.

All are invited to lay hands on Silas, or on the shoulders of someone laying their hands.

Silas receive the blessing of God, the Holy and Undivided Trinity. Walk in the Spirit, this day and always, knowing that God has made an everlasting covenant with you that shall never be cut off. **Amen**.

Presider Jesus said, "Rejoice that your names are written in heaven." (Luke 10:20)

People Amen. Alleluia.

Presider Holy One of blessing, you created us in your image and pronounced us good. We

give you thanks for the gift of life itself. We thank you for our individual names, which connect us to the One who spoke all creation into being. We rejoice in our

shared calling to the ministry of reconciliation. Amen.




LORD'S PRAYER Pray in the language of your heart:
