Preparing for Worship – Upon arrival, we keep silence in the church that we all may pray quietly in preparation for worship. Please remember to silence your cell phones.

Children's Chapel is available during the 9am Service. Children have a chance to engage the readings for the day at their speed, with a story and play based curriculum. The chapel is located down the long hallway behind the altar, the first room on the right when you get to the office area. Children will rejoin their caregivers just before the Peace.

Children of all ages are always welcome in worship! There are three soft spaces around the sanctuary where children and their caregivers can worship together in developmentally appropriate ways. In the narthex (entry way) you will find rocking chairs for parents of young children as well as worship supports for people of all ages including sensory tools, illustrated worship bulletins, children's books, and quiet toys. In addition, nursery care is provided in the Day School during the 9:00 Service.

Hearing Assistance: Hearing assistance devices are available from the ushers. Please ask for help if you need one. Our church also has a loop system: to activate, turn on your T-Coil.

Accessibility: If you need to sit, stand, or move at any time, please do not hesitate. We use the words "please rise in body or in spirit" to indicate the places where many of us will stand, but we know that bodies have different needs at different times.



Liturgy of the Word

The first part of the service is the Liturgy of the Word: we read and respond to appointed lessons from Scripture. We follow a three-year cycle of readings called the Lectionary. These are the same lessons being heard in congregations of many denominations throughout the world today.

We rise in body or spirit for the Gospel. Our posture indicates the importance we place on Jesus' words and actions. The Gospel book comes into the midst of the people and all turn toward the reader.



NICENE CREED Please rise in body or in spirit.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Word of God, all things in heaven and on earth are created through you and for you. We remember especially *here we name birthdays and anniversaries*. May we who care for your creation do so with all due respect. *Silence*

May we be stewards of your commonwealth on earth. Come to your people and set us free!

Savior Christ, remember this region in which we live and work and worship. Drive far from us all fear and dismay. Rescue the missing; find the lost. May all of your children live in safety. Silence

Help us to bring the lost, the least, and the left out into your reign of justice and wholeness.

Come to your people and set us free!

Christ our King, you know intimately the experience of pain and suffering in your own body. May all those suffering know that you are with them in their pain, may they feel your presence with them.

May we trust that your reign comes with justice and healing.

Come to your people and set us free!

You are invited to add your own prayers, silently or aloud.

Resurrected Christ, accept those who have died into your reign of love. Give all the departed peace, and in the fullness of time, raise them to newness of life. Unite us at the banquet at the end of days. *Silence*

Reunite us in the Communion of your Saints, where sorrow and pain are no more. **Come to your people and set us free!**


The deacon or presider says: Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor





The presider gives thanks to God for Christ's redeeming work, and remembers Jesus' last supper with his disciples. The prayer includes this response:

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The presider continues with prayer for the Holy Spirit to sanctify the bread and wine, and the gathered congregation.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. **AMEN.**

LORD'S PRAYER Pray in the language of your heart. Children are invited, during the Lord's Prayer and Breaking of the Bread to join around the altar, to help with the lifting up of the consecrated bread and wine.

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen. Communion:

We invite all who seek the presence of Christ to come forward to share with us in Holy Communion. The bread is received in the open palm; the wine is taken from the cup (placing your hand gently on the base of the chalice to guide it). If you require a gluten-free wafer, please tell the person who offers the bread to you.

If you or your children are drawn to the altar but do not wish to receive, please cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing from the priest. If you receive bread but choose not to receive wine, cross your arms when the chalice comes by. If you have not been baptized and wish to receive regularly, please speak with one of the clergy about our process that leads to baptism.

This prayer of Spiritual Communion is offered to those who cannot join us in person:

Gracious and Loving God, on this day we are not able to gather around your table to celebrate your presence in the sacrament of bread and wine. We are not able to share your peace with one another. Nevertheless, we lift up our hearts, we join with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven as we proclaim you holy and receive you into our hearts by faith. Strengthen our love for you. Help us offer our sacrifice with all your faithful people, that we may restore health and wholeness to one another and to all your creation. Give us patience and hope as we long for the day when we can gather and break bread together again, through Christ our Savior. Amen.

POSTLUDE

LITURGICAL CHANGES FOR SEPTEMBER

Emphasis on the Reign of Christ: On November 23, we celebrate the feast of the Reign of Christ. As the liturgical year ends, we proclaim Christ's reign not as domination, but as divine disruption. God's story breaks through our broken systems, revealing a kingdom shaped by justice and mercy. In Christ, we find not empire, but the love that reorders all things.

Children in Worship: At the 9am service, children are being invited to gather around the altar to help lift up "the gifts of God for the people of God" before communion. This simple act reminds us that children are not only the future of the church—they are full participants in our worship today. By being close to the altar and helping in this sacred moment, children experience the beauty and mystery of the Eucharist in a way that engages their hearts and imaginations. We encourage parents and caregivers to gently guide their children to listen closely during the Eucharistic Prayer, so they can recognize when their part comes and share in the joy of offering Christ's gifts with the whole congregation.
